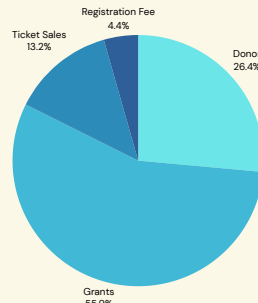
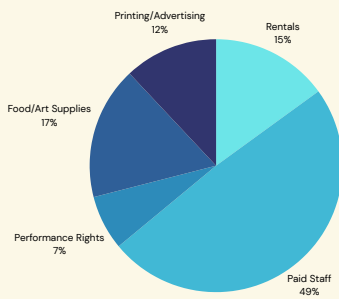


ANNUAL IMPACT REPORT-AAPA
